#### **SECTION 1: EuroSUPA EVENTS SEASON**

# 1. THE EuroSUPA EVENTS SEASON

The EuroSUPA events season is organized by the European SUP Association, in order to manage events and to enforce this rulebook. The results of all registered events shall be included in the EuroSUPA Ranking. Official individual titles will be delivered.

#### 2. CALENDAR

Duration of season:

The season takes place from February 1st to November 31st.

# 3. REGISTRATION OF EuroSUPA EVENTS

# 3.1. Registration deadline for EuroSUPA Events

The event organizers who wish to include their competition in the EuroSUPA schedule shall apply for admission with 3 months notice.

Any application form produced after the deadline will not be considered while drawing up the provisional schedule.

The first version of the season schedule will be distributed by the end of December.

Consequently, a priority regarding the choice of the dates will be given to the applications which will be received by the EuroSUPA Organizing Committee before December 25th.

The EuroSUPA Organizing Committee shall examine the registration forms produced; the reply concerning the registration in the provisional schedule shall be forwarded to the event organizer within two months

# 3.2. Events Registration

In order to register an event you must send an email to contact@eurosupa.com with:

- A presentation of the event dates proposed for the event
- Information about the event organizing committee person in charge and email address
- Planned promotional activities and media cooperation
- event website

Any other additional information concerning the event (photos, reports, previous editions) may be enclosed into this email.

#### 3.3. Publication of official calendar

The official schedule is published on the EuroSUPA website,

The schedule is updated, distributed and published as often as necessary during the season.

#### **Deadlines:**

#### **December 31st:**

Publication of the first version of the official season calendar

EuroSUPA confirmation for registration

# As often as necessary during the season

Update of the season schedule EuroSUPA confirmation for registration to the applicants within two months after receiving the Application

# 4. EVENTS CATEGORIES AND RANKING

#### 4.1. Event «Race»



The EuroSUPA events are classified by stars from 1\* to 6\* (refer to Appendix 1). Races Format:

- Beach races
- Long distance races
- Downwind

Several events 1\* and 2\*can happen at the same dates if they take place in different countries Several events 3\* to 6\* can NOT happen during the same week end.

Events 1\* or 2\* can happen the same week-end as a 3\*,4\*,5\* or 6\* if they take place in different countries

The EuroSUPA ranking points will be distributed according to the ranking point system (refer to Appendix 2)

#### Discards:

For each race category (beach race, long distance, downwind) the overall ranking takes into account the three best results of each rider, i.e. the total of his three highest number of points.

# **Equal rankings:**

After this calculation, if two or more riders have the same total of points, the ranking between them is based on their two best results (total of points for their two best results). If two or more riders have still the same numbers of points, the ranking between them is decided on their best result (number of points).

Assuming that this would not be enough to decide, the best ranking between these riders is attributed on the highest number of the same gender participants who were registered in the Elite category of the race in which the best result (number of points) was achieved.

# 2012 EuroSUPA annual ranking Race categories.

#### Beach Race:

- -Elite Men (3 best results)
- -Elite Women (3 best results)

# Long distance:

- -Elite Men (3 best results)
- -Elite Women (3 best results)

Other classifications : Elite men 12'6 / Elite women 12'6 / Elite men 14 / Elite men 14 / Elite men UL / Elite women UL

#### **Downwind:**

- -Elite Men (3 best results)
- -Elite Women (3 best results)

Note: participants in open categories will not accumulate points for the annual ranking.

# 4.4. EuroSUPA rankings

The results of each EuroSUPA sanctioned event should be forwarded to <a href="mailto:contact@eurosupa.com">contact@eurosupa.com</a> as soon as possible after the event and no more than 3 days after the event closure. Results should include:

-Full name, nationality, category and finish time of each participant.

EuroSUPA is responsible for establishing the overall season rankings, on the basis of the results sent by the organizers.



#### **SECTION 2: EVENT ORGANIZING STANDARDS**

#### 6. BASICS

The Organizer Manual is a guideline for SUP event organizers with an international status. The manual can also be used as a checklist. The organizer must fulfill the points. The EuroSUPA will examine those points before the event. If the organizer does not meet the requirements, he can be expelled from being a EuroSUPA event.

The organizer is responsible to carry out the event properly especially in regards of the financing (sponsoring), promotion (publicity), organization (competition and safety) and the side events (party).

# 7. REGISTRATION

# 7.1. Registration request

The organizer has to submit a complete documentation about the event which contains the following:

- the desired date of the event as well as an alternative date
- the persons of contact
- a plan of the race track/wave spots and pictures of it
- the concept of the event with budget
- the way of organizing / structure of the organization

# 7.2. Registration confirmation

If EuroSUPA confirms the request the organizer must sign and return this document

#### 8. MOST IMPORTANT REQUIREMENTS

#### 8.1. Participants

Anybody may participate at a EuroSUPA event: top athletes as well as hobby Stand Up paddlers, kids and young persons. The event organizer is the only responsible for complying with any legal issue related to the minors and to its safety obligations according to the type of participants.

# 8.2 Board Categories

12'6: Boards must be rudderless and monohull, max length: 12feet and 6 inches = 381cm

14': Boards must be rudderless and monohull, max length: 14 feet = 426,72cm

**Unlimited:** Boards may have a rudder and must be monohull, no size limit.

The board length is measured from nose to tail at ninety (90) degree angles from the boards natural flat laying position with the deck facing up.

Boards must be measured and approved previously to the riders start meeting.

#### 8.3. Beach Races

Boards must enter the "12'6 max" category

Every participant taking part in a beach race will automatically enter the Elite category. In some cases when the beach race takes place in breaking waves or other challenging conditions the organiser may decide to set up a non EuroSUPA "open Race "before or after the beach race with a short, easy course and several boards and age divisions to allow family, kids and recreational



paddlers to take part in the event.

# Categories and rankings per race:

Elite men Elite Women Open Boys Under16 Open Girls Under16

# Note for U16 categories:

- <u>For example in the season 2012</u>, must be born after 1/1/1997, included; U16 categories will be ranked in Elite for the event and the annual ranking as well as in their U16 categories for the event, the goal is to highlight the performance of the youngest riders.
- These U16 categories are highly recommended in EuroSUPA races. Nevertheless the organizer could decide that the U16 are not accepted due to justified reason (ex : safety...). This must be announced in the Notice of Race.

The minimum of participants per categories is : 1 (one)

The Prize money taken in consideration for the Ranking of the event (number of stars) is the total prize money for the Elite Categories.

Races with a mass start from the beach, finish on the beach at the same place, several laps and short sprint running on the beach between each lap, distances of 3 to 10km. Depending on the distance, 2 or more laps are to be done. For safety reasons the lap shall be at least 1,5km long Elite and open racers must start at the same time.

In some cases with a large number of participants or a beach too small to accommodate a mass start, 2 qualifying heats and a final can be organized, the drawing would be the following:

- Heat 1:50% of the total of riders from each category (ex:50% of the total Elites, 50% of the total Open men etc...)
- Heat 2:50% of the total of riders from each category (ex:50% of the total Elites, 50% of the total Open men etc...)

The length of the running sprint between laps must be between 20 meters and 50 meters. The rider must continuously keep his paddle with him while running, in some races the race director can decide that the rider must do the running sprint with both his board and paddle. No board or paddle swap allowed during the race.

# **8.4** Long Distance races

The organiser is responsible for the choice of the Board Category in the Elite Categories (the Category must be the same for Elite Men and Elite Women) ex:

Long distance Elite 12'6 or Long Distance Elite 14' or Long Distance Elite UL.

# Categories and rankings per race:

Every EuroSUPA long Distance Race must be open to all 3 board categories (12'6, 14 and UL):

Elite men (12'6 or 14 or UL)

Elite women (same as Elite Men)

12'6 Open Men (unless Elites are riding 12'6)

12'6 Open Women (unless Elites are riding 12'6)

12'6 Under16 Boys (except when the organizer decides not to open it for safety reasons)



12'6 Under 16 Girls. (except when the organizer decides not to open it for safety reasons)

14' Open Men (unless Elites are riding 14')

14' Open Women (unless Elites are riding 14')

Unlimited Open Men (unless Elites are riding UL)

Unlimited Open Women (unless Elites are riding UL)

# Note for U16 categories:

- <u>For example in the season 2012</u>, must be born after 1/1/1997, included. The goal is to highlight the performance of the youngest riders

In the case of a "Long Distance Elite 12'6", U16 categories will be ranked in Elite for the event and the annual ranking as well as in their U16 categories for the event, in the case of a U16 wishing to race in 14' or UL in this event he will be ranked in 14' Open or UL Open for this event. In the case of a "Long Distance Elite 14'" or "Long Distance Elite UL", U16 will be ranked in 12'6 Open as well as in U16 for the event.

- These U16 categories are highly recommended in EuroSUPA races. Nevertheless the organizer could decide that the U16 are not accepted due to justified reason (ex : safety...). This must be announced in the Notice of Race.

The minimum of participants per categories is : 1 (one)

Every rider is free to register either in Elite or Open Category.

The Prize money taken in consideration for the Ranking of the event (number of stars) is the total prize money for the Elite Categories.

A long distance race must be at least 10km long.

# 8.5 Downwinds:

In the scenario that a long distance race takes place in downwind conditions, riders will be ranked as usual for the long distance race and will also automatically enter in the Downwind ranking (same categories as Long Distance Races, see chapters 4.1 and 8.4)

To be validated as a downwind race the conditions on the courses must have been:

- -70 % of the distance in downwind conditions ex: 10km race: 7km must have been downwind
- -The wind in the downwind parts must have been pushing from the back with an angle between 0 and 45 degrees on both side of the perfect course line.
- -Wind strength on the downwind parts must have been at least 15 knots during the whole time of the race

# 8.6. Starting area:

#### Beach Start:

Competitors run to the water from the beach carrying their board and paddle Start line must be:

- no further than 5m from the shore
- -at least 1m wide per participant (ex : 100 participants : 100m)

The start line must do a 90 angle with and imaginary line going from the first buoy/course reference and the middle of the start line. The distance between them must beat least 200m. In case of moderate/strong side wind, this angle should be regulated moving buoys/references leeward or moving the start line windward in order to make it fair for all participants whereever they stand on the start line.

#### Water Start:



Competitors start from the water, standing or kneeling on their board with no initial speed. Start line must be at least 1m-wide per participant.

The start line must do a 90 angle with and imaginary line going from the first buoy/course reference and the middle of the start line for at least 200m.

In case of moderate/strong side wind, this angle should be regulated moving buoys/references leeward or moving the start line windward in order to make it fair for all participants on the start line.

#### 8.7. Finish area:

There must be at least 100m of straight line between the last buoy/course reference and the finish line. The finish line must be at least 5m wide for water finishes and 5m wide for beach finishes. There must be enough space behind the finish line to allow participants to clear the area safely immediately after crossing the finish line.

#### 9. EVENT INSURANCE

# 9.1. Participants must have individual accident and illness insurance

Each participant takes part at his own risk. The event announcement or program shall mention explicitly that the participant must be insured against accident and illness.

The event organizer is the only responsible for the compliance with the Country legal obligations and regulations regarding the documentation to be required by him to the participants (insurance, medical examination,...)

#### 9.2. Leash

The event announcement or program shall mention explicitly that the participant may be asked to wear a leash depending on the course and sea conditions.

The obligation to wear a leash, or the absence of this obligation, must be announced by the race director and/or speaker before each race at the riders meeting.

# 9.3. Public liability insurance for organizer

In most of the countries it is required by law that the organizers have a public liability insurance. In any case, the event organizer is the only responsible for complying with its Country legal obligations and regulations.

#### 10. SAFETY CONCEPT

All possible measures shall be taken in order to minimize the risk of accident and in order to ensure a maximum safety in the event, and this is under the responsibility of the events organizers. Suitable safety measures shall be taken in all potentially dangerous areas (rocks, currents...). Organizer must be very careful that there is no place or race situation that he can accept to present any danger for the athletes as well as for the public. Organizers should consider the following steps while elaborating the safety concept:

- 1. visit other SUP events
- 2. get expert advise about the race course from experienced Stand Up Paddlers
- 3. elaborate the security concept with a detailed plan of the race course/wave spot
- 4. optimize the security concept in cooperation with the local authorities.

#### 11. MANAGEMENT OF PARTICIPANT REGISTRATION

# 11.1. Information technology system



The event organizers must obtain for themselves an information technology system in order to manage registrations, numbering and scoring for races and surfing contests. It has also to allow the quick calculation of overall ranking points, in order to carry out the prize-giving ceremony immediately after the finish.

#### 11.2. Race numbers

The race numbers must have the following size:

Minimum: Height 15cm / Width 8 cm

They must appear in front and back of the rider.

Numbering determines the starting. Numbers are given by the event organizers according to the registrations.

# 11.3 Categories identification :

The organizers have to facilitate the clear identification of different categories taking part in the races. This is crucial for the understanding of the race unfolding as well for the racers as for the spectators. ex:

•Elite vs Open 12'6 vs Open 14'vs Open UL in long distance race

Typical means of identification:

- Preferably, colored jerseys/lycras/t-shirts....
- •At least colored race numbers
- •Additionally, colored board stickers, etc...

# 12. ATHLETES' AREA, CAR PARK AND DROP OFF ZONE

An area shall be arranged inside of the competition enclosure, exclusively devoted to the athletes registered in the competition, and used as dressing rooms. The public is not admitted to this area. A car park shall be offered to all competitors, who could have to confirm their need if the available space is limited. If not free, the price should be included in the registration. In the case of the car park being further than 500m of the event site, a drop off zone should be arranged to offer the participants the possibility to drop the boards as close as possible to the event site.

#### 13 PRIZE MONEY

# 13.1. Prize money per race

The prize money amount for each race/ categories has to be announced in the Notice Of Race and must be published before the race by written information in the fact sheet.

We recommend to split the prize money as follows:

Prize money should go only to the Elite Categories, other prizes may be given in the open categories, the value of the prizes in the open categories should never exceed the value of the prize money given to any top3 Elite rider.

amount of prize money for 1 gender should never be less than 1/3 of the amount of the total prize

In the case of having a big value prize for the open categories it should be drawn (by chance) among all the riders registered in open categories.

**Events 1 to 3 Stars:** Prize money for top 3 Elite Men and top 3 Elite Women. It is the organizer responsibility to decide the proportion of prize money for each gender; the



money for the Elites.

Ex : if total prize money for the Elites is 2000€

there should be at least 660€ prize money for one gender and no more than 1340€ prize money for the other gender.

Once the quantity of prize money for each gender is decided we recommend to split it as followed for each gender:

1st place : 50% 2nd place : 35% 3rd place : 15%

Ex : if total prize money for 1 gender is 300€ 1st gets 150€, 2nd gets 105€ and 3rd gets 45€

Events 4 to 6 Stars: Prize money for top 5 Elite Men and top 5 Elite Women.

It is the organizer responsibility to decide the proportion of prize money for each gender, the amount of prize money for 1 gender should never be less than 1/3 of the amount of the total prize money for the Elites.

Ex : if total prize money if 2400€

there should be at least 800€ prize money for one gender and no more than 1600€ prize money for the other gender.

Once the share of prize money between genders has been decided we recommend to split it as followed within each gender ranking:

1st place : 45% 2nd place : 25% 3rd place : 15% 4th place : 10% 5th place : 5%

Ex : if prize money for 1 gender is 3000€

1st gets 1350€, 2nd gets 750€ 3rd gets 450€, 4th gets 300€, 5th gets 150€

#### 13.2. Prize giving ceremony

The event organizer may award the athletes with the prize money during the hour following the official ranking. In case of drug tests, the event organizer shall award the athletes with the prize money after the confirmation of the official ranking by the EuroSUPA following the results of the drug test.

Every top 3 winners of each categories must be called on the podium in the following order:

#### Beach Race:

Open Boys U16 Open Girls U16 Elite men Elite Women

Long distance Race:

Open women 12'6 (if applies)



Open Men 12'6 (if applies)
Open U16 12'6 (if applies)
Open U16 14 (if applies)
Open women 14 (if applies)
Open Men 14 (if applies)
Open Women UL (if applies)
Open Men UL (if applies)
Elite Women
Elite Men

We strongly recommend the organizers to have prizes to be given to every top 3 winners of each categories.

Please always remember the high importance of setting up a nice podium and of respecting the protocol for both Open and Elite categories.

#### 14. DRUG TESTS

If a drug test is implemented by an Anti-Doping Agency, it shall take place in compliance with Country national law and regulations. The event organizer must comply with all the requirements of the procedure, particularly the provision of assistants and suitable facilities.

#### 15. EVENT REPORT

A report will be drawn up notifying the main issues concerning the competition. It must be written by the event organizer and forwarded to the EuroSUPA organization within 3 days.

# 16. PRESS / MEDIA REPORT

A report will be drawn up notifying the main issues concerning the promotional activities and press work. It must be written by the event organizer and forwarded to the EuroSUPA organization within 10 days.



#### **SECTION 3: TECHNICAL REGULATION**

#### 17. FAIR PLAY:

Athletes must participate in competitions with fair-play and enthusiasm. All those who show a negative attitude or an evident inability might be excluded from the competition. Athletes should strictly comply with the provisions supplied by the jury or by the organization, particularly as far as safety is concerned.

# 18. GENERAL RULES FOR RACES:

A competitor shall only use the paddle, waves and wind to propel the board forward during the race. No outside assistance from boat wakes, sails, clothing designed to catch wind, or any other speed device not considered the norm to SUP racing is allowed.

Only single blade paddles can be used.

A competitor must be standing while paddling on the course from the start line until crossing over the finish line.

A competitor is allowed to sit, lay or kneel only for resting during a race.

Once a competitor takes more than five strokes while sitting, laying or kneeling during the race, this competitor is disqualified in the race and shall receive a DNF.

The exception to the Standing Only rule is for any safety reasons where a competitor needs to avoid a potentially dangerous situation. In this case, he could not receive any benefit for the race ranking resulting from this situation.

All paddlers must wear event jerseys and/or identification numbers and/or GPS during the entire race, failure to do so will mean immediate disqualification.

In case of courses with several laps, right of way must be given to the overlapping competitors. It is the moment when the rider crosses the finish line (and not the board) that is taken in consideration for arrival time and ranking.

Protests can be lodged maximum 15mn after the arrival of the last competitor, it should be written in English or in the language of the country where the race takes place, it should include :Date, time, name of the participant lodging the protest, incident's description, grounds of the complaint, evidences, name of witnesses and signature.

# 20. WITH RESPECT TO THE EVENT ORGANIZERS

EuroSUPA Rulebook is not a contractual document between EuroSUPA and an event organizer.

# 21. WITH RESPECT TO THE EVENT COMPETITORS

The responsibility of EuroSUPÄ is strictly limited to the following: EuroSUPA will establish and distribute the overall season rankings, on the basis of the results forwarded by the events organizers.

# 22. WITH RESPECT TO ANY OTHER PARTY

The organization of an event is under the only responsibility of the event organizer. EuroSUPA does not participate in the event organization. The event organizer must comply with all the country laws, regulations and obligations and he is the only liable person/entity in case of breach of compliance.
